### A day for fun and business!

According to the December 24, 2021, issue of <u>OrthoEvidence</u>, 41,692 physicians in the United States who logged golf rounds in the US Golf Association database as of August 2018 were included in an observational study assessing differences in golf habits and performance across specialties. The results of this observational study suggest that amongst golfing physicians in America, the majority of whom are men, orthopaedic surgeons are amongst the most frequent and best golfers around.

This study was limited by the self-reported golf performance, which could be subject to bias due to an overstating of their golf ability. Future research is required to understand whether golf performance is associated with superior patient outcomes and physician wellbeing.

- 1) Understand hip preservation surgery and identify candidates and indications for periacetabular osteotomy.
- 2) Understand that advocating for your patients through the political process is an essential component of being a good physician.

- 6) Learn the advantages, disadvantages, and indications for T-pins as an option for fixation of distal ulna fractures.
- 7) Understand the principle of the Golden Circle Model to improve your business or organization, summarize challenges that face orthopaedic surgeons in providing patient care and describe the unique opportunities that exist within orthopaedics and in healthcare to overcome challenges and provide career and life satisfaction.
- 8) use absolute neutrophil count in synovial fluid as a biomarker for diagnosing periprosthetic joint infections.
